    - 16,887 paid attendance (+6,000 over 2018)
  - \$25,650 sponsorships/donations (+\$5,000 over 2018)
- Expenses \$95,673 (+\$35,000 over 2018)

- a) Jr. Fair Board
  - Joy Sharp
    - Jr. Fair Board applications due September 1.
    - 4-H Banquet September 23. Sr. Fair Board and Livestock & Sale Committee will receive invitations in the mail.
    - Denise Flynn in OSU extension retiring. Doing an open house on Monday, August 19.

- b) Livestock & Sale Committee/Jeff Wippel
  - Fair checks were picked up Aug 2 & 3. Making phone calls to get the rest distributed.
  - Got feedback from committee on fair.
  - Asking SFB for approval 2021 eliminate Fat Dairy Steer Class/Project. Only had 2. Only 1 of the 2 made weight.
- c) Gun-A-Palooza/Von Cremeans
  - A staff schedule and logistics/info sheet for GAP event was distributed to all directors in attendance.
  - Set up every evening week of Aug 19. Von will be here every evening. Call him if you're available to help. All hands on deck. No maintenance staff all week. Friday evening is "set up" night with all prizes.
  - 30 VIP tables sold this year vs 11 last year. Corky Que doing food in VIP tent.
  - Anyone working that will be getting paid let Sean know asap so that he can have checks made up ahead for pick up/distribution that day.
    Groups getting paid \$1,000 per 8 people
  - Westfall doing food this year. Becky Shaw coordinating. Has 25 people to help vs 6 last year. Have signage and limit per person per trip. Different foods located in different places. Increased all food significantly.
    - Increased all food by quite a bit: 100 lbs pork...250 packages of bratwursts...popcorn (2 popcorn machines), pretzels, and pub mix on all tables are new addition
  - Chris Pence working on getting a reefer truck.
  - Jay Jude will be announcer/emcee.
  - 4 white boards to write winning numbers & texting service
  - Sound system is supposed to be replaced by the end of this week.
  - 2 ATM machines this year instead of 1. Each has \$20k. Provided by guy doing casino. Will be here to refill them if needed
  - Side guns doubled from 10 to 20.
  - All directors need to be arrive no later than 9am. All other workers need to arrive by 10:30.
  - Gates open at noon.

## VIII. Old Business

- a) Gator John year round service/Randy Smith
  - 4 units \$9.38/ea. \$297/month for port-a-johns. Unit between barn 1 & 2 never gets used. Can be eliminated. Randy Smith moved to approve reducing to 3 units only. Brad seconded. Motion carried.
  - Clean bathrooms, 16 units, 5 sinks = \$2,000
  - Scott is getting price for hand dryers. Hopefully will have installed by 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- b) Westfall Dirt Drag/Von Cremeans
  - Dirt Drag is Sat, Sept 21. Westfall takes care of all coordination set up and tear down.

- c) September rented amphitheater for wedding & reception in HH. Charged for amphitheater only in trade for marketing pics of event.
- d) Horseman's tractor Von Cremeans will sell on FB Marketplace
- e) Claim on our tractor. Needs to go to Evolution Ag. Still under full warranty.

  - a) Destruction of ballots/Von Cremeans. Carlee Stewart moved to have 7/8/19 ballots destroyed. Scott Pritchard seconded. Motion carried.
  - b) Steve Barthelmas moved to eliminate Dairy Fats Project starting with 2021 fair per recommendation by Livestock & Sale Committee. Randy Smith seconded. Motion carried.
  - c) Increase credit limit/Von Cremeans It is \$15,000 limit. Requesting to move it to \$20,000. Craig Weiler moved to approve request. Randy Smith seconded. Motion carried.
  - d) Mike Wolford/Clearcreek EMI has always used portable bleachers for their tractor pull. They transport. Scott Pritchard moved to approve request. Steve Barthelmas seconded. Motion carried.
  - e) Scrubber/Craig Weiler We rented a scrubber for pavement/concrete after fair. Craig Weiler came across a squeegee for sale for \$6,500. We need one for outdoors. CraigWeiler moved to spend up to \$6,500. Chad Black seconded. Motion carried
  - f) Grounds clean-up/maintenance Darin Myers is committed to being on the property every Sunday to do miscellaneous work and encouraged all other directors to make a commitment to also work to maintain the grounds regularly. Much easier to keep up on tasks consistently than to have to do everything all at once before an event. There was storm damage to fence and drive-in gate shack.
